

CANCELLATION POLICY/REFUNDS

If you must cancel your camper's participation in Camp Soulajule, please notify the Walker Creek Ranch Office immediately at (415) 491-6602. Cancellation fees will be applied as follows:

If notice of cancellation is received:	Refund is calculated at:
60+ days prior to camp	25% of registration fees
30-59 days prior to camp	50% of registration fees
0-29 days prior to camp	100% of registration fees

FOOD

The kitchen staff focuses on presenting nutritious and delicious camp food with some vegetarian options. Although we are not able to prepare several different meals, we try to accommodate campers with special dietary needs. If you supply us with these special foods, we will see that your child receives it. If your child is a vegetarian, please indicate so on the health form, so that we can plan accordingly.

WEATHER

West Marin County is known for the unpredictability of its weather. Rain at this time of year is unusual, but not unheard of! Cool mornings and warm sunny afternoons are the rule, but foggy weather can prevail. We could get temperatures anywhere between 50-90 degrees. Please send clothes accordingly. Layering is the best solution to our variable weather conditions.

STAFF

MEDICAL CONCERNS

Please fill out the enclosed Camper Health Form and quickly return it to us. The safety and physical well-being of your child is of the utmost concern to us. Our staff are all certified in first-aid and CPR and the paramedics at Hicks Valley Fire Station are prepared to respond in a matter of minutes should any emergency arise. California State law requires that all **prescription and non-prescription medications** (including aspirin and allergy medication) be in their original container and kept in a locked location. Please turn these medicines in at the Health table on arrival day.
